AidLearn promotes the seminar "Refugees in Europe"

In order to discuss the reality of the critical humanitarian situation of refugees in Europe in the last few years, some 70 people met in the seminar "Refugees of Europe", promoted by AidLearn, on 14 April. The activity - with free access through prior registration - happened at the *Centro Social de Belém*, in Lisbon, Portugal.

During the event, the RefugeesIN project was introduced and then the documentaries "Daud" and "Tomorrow is Best" were displayed and applauded with great enthusiasm by the audience. Participants also had the opportunity to hear moving testimonies of a volunteer mission in Lesbos, represented by Joana Garcia da Fonseca and the documentary protagonists, Daud Al Anazy, Ismail Haki and Mohamad Abou Ras.

Participant Cielo Velez praised the organizations and promoters of the event and was moved by the witnessed stories. "And if it was me? If they were my children, to have





In order to improve the sustainability of European micro and small businesses in the tourism sector, the Sustain-T project held several workshops - Curriculum Validation Workshop - in Portugal, Hungary, Bulgaria and the United Kingdom in May and June 2018.

The Curriculum Validation Workshop aims to validate the curriculum designed to meet the identified sustainability needs. It is intended for owners and managers of micro and small tourism companies and for education / training entities.

In Portugal, the event took place in Lisbon on May 29, with the organization of AidLearn - Consultancy in Human Resources. On May 30, the event took place in the city of Szeged, Csongrád, Hungary, under the leadership of Csongrad County Chamber of Commerce. Many helpful ideas and suggestions have been discussed with MSEs in the local tourism sector. The event took place at CSMKIK.

In Plymouth, UK, Sustain-T's Curriculum Validation Workshop was held on June 6. The next day, on June 7, the workshop was held in Sofia, Bulgaria, where representatives of the Ministry of Tourism, tourism agencies, universities, professional training organizations and micro and small tourism companies gathered. 2nd DIDO Project Meeting in Finland

The 2nd "Dropping in the drop-outs" (DIDO) project meeting was held in Karjaa, Finland, on April 18 and 19, 2018. The meeting was attended by representatives of six partner organizations: CVO Antwerpen (Belgium), Axxel (Finland), HF & VUCFYN (Denmark), ROC West-Brabant (Netherlands), AidLearn (Portugal) and Swiss Federation of Adult Learning Switzerland).

Márcia Silva and Paulo Rodrigues were the representatives of AidLearn who participated in the meeting led by Sylvana Vanaert, coordinator of the DIDO project.



Registration of activities carried out in Finland

At this meeting, the results obtained in the research phase were presented in Belgium, Denmark, the Netherlands Portugal. The research phase revealed that the main reasons for the abandonment of adult learning in partner countries are grouped into six major themes: Expectations; Group Organizational Issues: Personal dvnamic: Competencies reasons; / Skills: Future Objectives / Perspectives.

It also tested and discussed the methodology to be implemented in the "Brainstorming" sessions, to be held in each partner country, to collect as many innovative and creative solutions to combat abandonment in Adult Education.

The Divina team met at AidLearn headquarters for the 4th Project Meeting in Lisbon, Portugal, on June 28. The purpose of the meeting was to define the activities of the project regarding the preparation of modules, translations and application of the pilot tests.

The five project modules are being finalized, including evaluation questions. It was decided that each partner will translate two of the modules by the end of August of this year to be tested in pilot action, and all modules should be tested, to collect feedback and improve before Multipliers Events.

The pilot actions - test modules - will be held in each country with about 20 participants during the month of October 2018. Participants should be adult educators and collaborators of adult education organizations.


2nd StereoSciFi Transnational Meeting took place in Lodz, Poland.

StereoSciFi partners met on 25 and 26 June in the city of Lodz, Poland, for the 2nd Transnational Meeting of the project. The main objectives were to establish the layout of the first product of the project, the Catalog of Films and Books of Scientific Fiction; and present the guidelines for the second product of the project, the bag of activities to carry out with the students.

The StereoSciFi project uses the approach of science fiction books and films in schools to introduce and discuss topics related to social stereotypes and discrimination in an innovative and engaging way among young people. Each book and film is presented with identification; history; stereotypes portrayed; link to some other information considered relevant by the partnership and for the official trailer of the films.

During the meeting the 4 films and 4 books included in the Catalog were selected, which will be the basis for the creation of the activities for the students. The books are: "I will fear no evil", "Nightfall", "The city and the stars", "Cinder". "Divergent", "In Time", "What Happened to Monday" and "Valerian and the City of a Thousand Planets".

The first product of the project is being finalized and will soon be available for free download in English and in the partner languages: Portuguese, Spanish, Italian, Polish and Lithuanian. It is a catalog that includes 12 films and 12 science fiction books that present situations / societies in which there are several social stereotypes or social organizations that are quite different from the society in which we live, but which





allow reflection / discussion on prejudices and stereotypes that are often the basis of discrimination and violence. The books and films selected are appealing to teenagers, and have a scientific basis.

TToP closure to take place in London

The Taking to the Top Project will take place on September 27 at the International Curriculum Framework for Adult Educators Conference organized by the Global Learning and Skills Partnership at Morley College in London, UK. During the event, the final products will be presented, with emphasis on the Course Guide for Adult Educators in 21st Century Skills.

The project activities emphasize the development of curriculum frameworks for adult educators, including pilot and curriculum dissemination activities, by adult education organizations from six European countries (Estonia, Greece, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland and the United Kingdom).

TToP promotes piloting action in Montijo

The TTop project promoted a pilot session of the Training Course for Educators for the skills of the century. XXI, at the Centro Qualifica do Montijo, at the premises of the Poeta Joaquim Serra School, in Montijo (Portugal), on January 3 of this year. The action was the 2nd piloting, since the first one was held in Tallinn (Estonia) in September 2017.

The main objective of the pilot activity was to collect feedback from adult educators on 9 modules already developed within the scope of TPT. Piloting took place during one day, when the curricular structure of the project was presented, in more detail, module 8, created by partners

from Portugal, which addresses the theme "Relevance and needs for local development" and includes activities, with focus on the Sharing Economy.

participants considered the modules innovative and interesting and the structure of the course quite complete. The carried on the activities out Sharing Economy have aroused a great deal of interest and several educators have already stated or intend to carry out some Sharing Economy activities in their locality, including, they stated that they will start to pass this type of activities to their adult learners.

On 25 and 26 January in Söderhamn, Sweden, the Taking to the Top Project partners met at the 4th Partners' Meeting to collect the conclusions of the "National Pilot" workshops of each partner of the project, at the Center for Adult Education in the region.

Representatives of partner institutions from Estonia, Portugal, United Kingdom, Greece, Sweden and Switzerland were present. Based on the feedback gathered in these National Pilots, it is possible to improve and finalize the structure of the TToP course, and begin to prepare the third product of the project: the Recommendations for Implementation of Curriculum Framework. The strategy of disseminating the project and its products was also discussed.

5th Partner Meeting to take place in Switzerland

In Lausanne, Switzerland, the 5th Meeting of Partners of TToP was held on May 3, with the participation of all project partners. The project activities focus on the development of the adult educator curriculum, including pilot activities and project dissemination.

The main objectives of the meeting were the final drafting of the curricular structure, based on tests and analyzes, together with recommendations from experts (completion and approval of O1, O2 and O3); organization of Multipliers Events for the introduction of "Intellectuals Outputs" at

national level and transnational event for the introduction of Intellectuals Outputs at international level and solution of translation problems.

The Multipliers Events will be held in September and October 2018, an event in each partner country. In the UK there will be an international conference at the end of September, and the other countries will be national workshops. In Portugal, it will be held in early October, where the main products of the project will be presented, and there will be the possibility to explore some of the activities of TPT and to learn about other projects and initiatives addressed to adult educators.




The second meeting of the Geomarketing as an Entrepreneurship Tool (GET UP) was held in Lisbon, Portugal, on 7 and 8 June 2018. The meeting was attended by representatives of six partner organizations: Luiss Guido Cali (Italy), AidLearn (Portugal), Aristotelio Panepistimio Thessalonikis (Greece), Esri Portugal (Portugal), Westbic (Ireland) and Universidad de Salamanca (Spain).

The main objective of the GET UP project is to develop a b-learning course in a learning platform on

entrepreneurship, geomarketing and intelligent location, to train young people up to 25 years old - with secondary or higher education qualifications, unemployed or looking for the 1st

employment - to implement their business ideas, becoming entrepreneurs.

The course will allow you to understand complex phenomena through the use of geomarketing techniques, creating geographic relationships inherent in relevant spatial data, and learning to use that concept as a management tool to attract investment and business opportunities.

SMS Project conducts research on the digital inclusion of migrant women

During the first half of 2018, the Social Media Sisterhood Project (SMS) conducted in-depth research on the inclusion of migrant women and the use of social networks. The research was developed in each of the partner countries of the project: Sweden, Portugal, United Kingdom and Italy.

Literature research focused on national legislation and policies that support the social inclusion of migrant women; in the strategies and organizations that deal with the social inclusion of this group; statistical data on migrant women and the use of social networks; and the opportunities and main obstacles migrant women face in their social inclusion. The information collected is compiled into a final report.

There has also been research with migrant women and technicians working with this population. In each country a Focus Group with a minimum of 6 collaborators / technicians who work in the social inclusion of migrants was carried out; a Focus Group with migrant women and individual interviews with migrant women.

AidLearn held the Focus Group with six migrant women, mostly from Brazil, and all shared experiences of their inclusion and expressed interest in following the project and participating in future training.

The Focus Group with the technicians was done using a social network, LinkedIn, to be able to have participants from various parts of the country. Some important issues have been presented, such as the constant change in the processes for inclusion and the lack of reliable centralized information to

help this population. The individual interviews were held in Lisbon with migrant women from Pakistan and Bangladesh.

The next step in the project will be the preparation of training materials for the modules, which will be tested on two groups of migrant women in each partner country by the end of 2018 and early 2019. SMS courses will be released on Facebook.

PROFESSIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

This training program has the thematic objective of promoting sustainability and the quality of employment and supporting labor mobility, taking into account the skills development needs of the regional organizations' assets. It should be noted that participation has been active and very committed in the different courses.
