




The Final Conference of the Green Tour Project was held at Budapest Business School on January 28, with an audience of around 100 participants.

The special guest Dr. Krisztian Egyed discussed the Hungarian National Tourism Strategy. The trends of

tourism courses and the importance of ecotourism in Hungarian higher education were addressed by Dr. Henrietta Nagy (SZIU), giving a clear idea of how the Hungarian educational system addresses the theme of tourism, with special emphasis on green tourism.

Pilot Actions

During this period pilot actions are taking place in schools in Portugal (Emídio Navarro High School), Spain (Professional School in Otxarkoaga), Poland (Lodz region) and Lithuania (Telsiai region).

Pilot action

During the first quarter of the year, the first pilot action of the SMS Training program took place in the different partner countries: Sweden, United Kingdom, Italy and Portugal.

2nd Meeting

On the 18th and 19th of February, the 2nd meeting was held in Seville and was attended by all the partners, with the exception of ANDRAS (Estonia).

At the meeting was presented the first research report of the project where the final format of the project was agreed. There will be a final version of the report that will be available in mid-April.

The second Bigger Picture result will be the competency framework for adults and adult educators.

During the meeting, based on the research done and the experience of the partners, there were two working groups with the purpose of structuring the Frameworks.

The structure is divided into 7 modules:

- 1. Human rights and global conflicts;
 - 2. Environment;
 - 3. Global citizenship;
- 4. Poverty, hunger and malnutrition;
 - 5. Economics and globalization;
 - 6. Global communication;
 - 7. Energy



Skills will be specified through the determination of learning objectives. The activities of each partner regarding this outcome will be agreed and distributed by the end of June.







The Chain project is designed to deal with the processes of "de-industrialization" that occur in the EU. There is a considerable need for Europe to learn how to deal with industry digitization. Through industry 4.0 (I4.0), Chain aims to understand the impact of these changes on the EU industry. Learn more at:



Changes in SMEs by industry 4.0

The Chain project aims to provide a foundation for the creation of new competencies for university students and SMEs in order to deal with the change caused by the "revolution". There is a great need for Europe to learn to deal with the digitization of society which is obscuring the lines between workers and self-employed, goods and services, or consumers and producers. There are challenges for the participation of SMEs in production chains I4 (costs, risks, reduced flexibility and reduction of strategic independence).

Introsys is responsible for software design for robots and industrial weapons, with a special focus on Automotive and Aeronautics. Course "Works at Height"

The training was held on February 2 and 3 at Arruda dos Vinhos, an action under the theme "Works at height", levels I and IV, lasting 16 hours.

Addressing workers who are in charge of carrying out work at height by ropes, it aimed at facilitating the development of the required competencies for working at height. Vitor Canha and Bruno Canha were the trainers responsible for the action.





It integrated face to face sessions, case studies and demonstrations in loco. Teamwork was encouraged, providing preventive and corrective measures to carry out work in height by rope, in order to reduce and / or eliminate accidents.

To participate in this course, the trainees must have the mandatory

IPE (individual protection equipment) for working at height.

Theme in Spotlight

Stereotypes, Prejudices and Discrimination

STEREOTYPES: Beliefs about the characteristics, attributes, and behaviours of members of particular groups, are rigid and schematic ways of thinking that result from simplification processes and are generalized to all the elements of the group to which they refer. Hence we can define stereotype as the set of beliefs that gives a simplified picture of the characteristics of a group or the members of a group.

PREJUDICES: Attitude that differs from stereotype because it is not limited to attributing characteristics to a particular group or person: it involves an often negative assessment. Thus we can define prejudice as an attitude that involves a mostly negative pre-judgment towards people or social groups.

DISCRIMINATION: Behaviour directed at individuals targeted by prejudice. Thus, on the basis of discrimination is prejudice, which, being unfounded, unjustified, directed at groups and their members, generally unfavourable, can lead to discrimination.
