

A Week of Learning and Training Activities in Spain

Between October 17th and 19th, comprehensive week of activities took place in Bilbao, Spain. Two educators from each partner country actively participated in these activities. Their active participation centered on learning and testing the course and its associated activities, which are designed for young individuals aged 12-16.



The activities focused on the following topics: Sexual harassment/sexual harassment; Gender-based violence; Combatting stereotypes and normative gender roles; Selfempowerment. The course's primary goal is to raise awareness, prevent and reduce discriminatory behaviors and attitudes, provide effective tools on how to deal with these behaviors and attitudes, and deconstruct stereotypical and normative gender roles and views.




A Transnational Meeting in Spain



Training "WORKING AT HEIGHT"

As part of our training offer, a training course on the theme "Working at Height", Level I, Level II and Level IV, took place on the 2nd and 3rd of December at Arruda dos Vinhos, lasting 16 hours. To participate in this course, trainees must have PPE for working at heights.

This training course, aimed at workers who are responsible for carrying out work at height using ropes, aimed to provide trainees with skills in working at height. With a theoretical methodology in the classroom, case study presentation and demonstration in the practical component. Teamwork was encouraged, providing preventive and corrective measures for carrying out work at height using ropes, in order to reduce and/or eliminate accidents.



More training courses on this thematic will be scheduled for 2024!






